Surveys on the 35th Parallel R. R. Line. gineer Kingman has passed Peach Spring and by the 22d inst. expected to be campe in Aubrey Valley and will then draw hi supplies from Prescott. He expects to the Little Colorado within four month the Little Colorado within four months, as the route from Aubrey Valley to the Little Colorado is heavy work and will require more time. Kingman reports the heaviest grade found between the crossing of the Colorado River, near the Needles and Aubrey Valley, to be ninety-five feet per nile, and generally a very favorable line, but few miles of heavy grade is found thus far on the surve ved line.
