

From Arizona City.

The *Free Press* of the 17th ult., came to hand Monday last, with news to the effect that, on the morning of the 13th ult., three prisoners confined in the county jail, awaiting trial for murder; viz: Gertrude, Cozad and an Indian named Que-cha-ca, made their escape through a hole made by them, or some friend of theirs, in the wall of the fire-place; that Sheriff Tyng, upon learning that they had decamped, despatched Deputy Sheriffs Pickens and Lockwood, together with some Indians, who followed their trail, found them asleep on the bank of the Colorado, when Cozad and Gertrude were re-captured, taken back to Arizona City and lodged in a more secure place than the jail. Upon hearing his pursuers approach, the Indian, who, it appears, belongs to one of the bands in the vicinity of Date Creek, jumped into the Colorado river, (saying good-bye, white men), and escaped.
