



The San Diego *Union* of September 26th notices the arrival at that city of Lieutenant W. S. Wyatt, U. S. A., who is on his way to Camp McDowell, for duty there.

The same number of the *Union* has the particulars of the murder of Sheriff Dana, of Yuma county, who was killed by an Indian about the 20th. It appears that the Sheriff, in the discharge of his duty, was searching for stolen property among the huts of the Indians, when a squaw approached him from behind and struck him a heavy blow on the shoulder, with an axe, making a large gash. He at once drew his pistol, and turning suddenly around discharged it at the squaw, wounding her in the side, and was, himself, almost at the same instant, shot dead by an Indian, who lodged an arrow in the region of the heart.
