We have been presented with a copy of the latest amendment to the finternal Revenne Law, approved April 10th, 1862. It comes down hard on deniers in liquor. Under its provisions, any party selling injune in quantities of the gallous party esting injune in quantities of the gallous and unwards, is to be regarded as a wholesale injune dealer, and is to pay a yearly tax of 8169. Those selling in less quantities than the gallous are considered retail liquor dealers, and are to pay \$25 per annum. Any person who pays iax as a wholesale cleaker, must, if he sells in less a wholesale cleaker, must, if he sells in less quantities than five gallous, also pay the lax of \$25 as a retailer.

Under the old law, a person in business could sell up to \$25,000 before being considered a wholesale liquor dealer. This new act draws a finer distinction between wholesale and retail injunct dealers, which seems to be in favor of the latter, as wholesale dealers cannot do a bottle business, without paying a retail lax also. The law is certainly the hardest yet studied up by our benefit public servants.
